

How the Game Commission Makes \$5.786 Million in Gas and Oil Revenue Disappear from the Books in their 2007-08 Annual Report

- P 20 Gas and Oil Revenue is \$5,786,125 but it is NOT deposited in their bank – they hide this \$5,786,125 by a Secret Gas and Oil Deal and are given 6,663 acres of land instead of cash
- Pp 31 – 35 clearly show no \$5,786,125 was ever deposited, BUT on page 35, their land acquisition is listed as \$229,392:

- Page 20 shows how much gas they sold for 6,663 acres of land, but the transaction was never recorded on the books

The Board of Commissioners approved eight leasing actions during 2007-08. Four of these approved actions were oil/gas development leases, which garnered a total bonus value of \$5,786,125 and enabled the Commission to acquire a total of 6,663 acres to be used for the benefit of wildlife and sportsmen.
